+ Mother's Day Novena +

As we do each year, we have made available to you, 'Mother's Day Novena Cards.' The cards are available in the rear of the church, in both *English* and *Spanish*. Please complete the 'outer envelope' with the name(s) of those you wish to have remembered in the novena, and return it, along with your offering, in the Sunday collection. The novena will begin with the *Vigil Mass of Mother's Day, on Saturday evening, May 11h*. The names of those begin remembered will be published in the bulletin, and the 'intention envelopes' that you return, will be placed on the altar. **The 'intention envelopes' must be returned, no later than, Sunday, May 4th.**

CONFIRMATION

Each year, Bishop Robert Brennan, extends a special privilege (*'indult'*) to the Pastors of the church, to celebrate the sacrament of 'Confirmation' with those 'adults,' who for various reasons, have never been confirmed. The special privilege can only be exercised on the *Feast of Pentecost*, when the Church celebrates the gift of the Holy Spirit. This year the *Feast of Pentecost is May 19th*, and we will be celebrating the *Sacrament of Confirmation at the 11:00am Mass*.

For those 'adults' who have been 'Baptized,' who have perhaps also received the 'First Holy Communion,' but have never been 'Confirmed,' please contact Fr. Orlando at the Parish Office for additional information and requirements. This is important especially for those persons who have been asked to be a sponsor for another person's confirmation, or if you plan to marry in the near future. You need to be a 'Confirmed Christian' yourself, before you can be a sponsor for someone, or in order to be married in the Catholic Church.



CONFIRMACIÓN

Cada año, el Obispo Robert Brennan, extiende un privilegio especial (*'indulto'*) a los Pastores de la Iglesia, para celebrar el sacramento de la 'Confirmación' con aquellos 'adultos', que por diversas razones, nunca han sido confirmados. El privilegio especial sólo puede ejercerse en la *fiesta de Pentecostés*, cuando la Iglesia celebra el don del Espíritu Santo. Este año la *Fiesta de Pentecostés es el 19 de mayo*, y celebraremos el *Sacramento de la Confirmación en la Misa de las 11:00 am*.

Para aquellos 'adultos' que han sido 'Bautizados', que tal vez también han recibido la 'Primera Comunión', pero nunca han sido 'Confirmados', por favor comuníquese con el Padre Orlando en la Oficina Parroquial para obtener información adicional y requisitos. Esto es importante especialmente para aquellas personas a las que se les ha pedido que sean padrinos para la confirmación de otra persona, o si planean casarse en un futuro cercano. Necesitas ser un "cristiano confirmado" tú mismo, antes de que puedas ser padrino de alguien, o para casarte en la Iglesia Católica.

Mary, the Virgin of merciful love

That great love of wife, of mother, of friend that was breathed around him, was interwoven with a thousand and one details.

Among the many titles by which we refer to Mary is that of Mother of Merciful Love. She is the Mother of Christ, the Mother of God. And God is love. God wanted, without a doubt, to choose a Mother adorned especially with the quality or virtue that defines Him. That is why Mary had to live the virtue of love, of charity to a very high degree. It was certainly one of its main hallmarks. Moreover, she has been the only creature capable of a perfect and pure love, without a shadow of selfishness or disorder. For she alone has been immaculate; and so only She has been able to love God, Her Son, as He deserved and wanted to be loved.

That love of his was a concrete and real love. Love is not pretty words. They are works. "Love is the very fact of loving," St. Augustine will say. Charity is not good wishes. It is selfless surrender to others. And that is precisely what we find in the life of the Blessed Virgin: an authentic love, translated into a gift of self to God and to others. Mary radiated love on all four sides and several miles around. The house of the holy family was to be imbued with charity.

As well as its neighborhood, the entire town and even much of the region... The expansive slingshots of love, when it is real, diffuse prodigiously with unsuspected lengths. The love of the Virgin in the house of Nazareth, as in the others where she lived, would make her really smell of heaven there. That great love of wife, of mother, of friend that was breathed around him, was interwoven with a thousand and one details. With what smile and tenderness the Blessed Virgin would open each new day of Joseph and the child with her punctual and welcoming "good morning"; and in the same way I would close it with a "good night" full of request and affection. How many pleasant surprises and gifts awaited the Child God behind each "happy birthday" followed by the kiss and embrace of his Mother. How she knew how to prepare the stews that Joseph liked the most; and those others who loved the baby Jesus. How good it was for her to always have clean and tidy clothes of the two men in the house. With how much attention and patience he would listen to the childhood adventures that Jesus told him after his tireless adventures with his friends; and also the successes and misfortunes of José's carpenter's day. How many times will Mary have rushed to finish the housework to bring a snack to her husband and lend him a hand at work. It was love that transformed each of these seemingly normal and banal acts into sublime. Where there is love, the most normal becomes extraordinary and there is no such thing as banal. In Mary no caress was superficial or mechanical, no tired or distracted embrace, no repertoire kiss, no false smile. "In her," says St. Bernard, "there is nothing severe, nothing terrible; it's all sweetness." Everything he did was imbued with that vividness of love that never withers.

Entre los muchos títulos con los que nos referimos a María está el de Madre del Amor Misericordioso. Ella es la Madre de Cristo, la Madre de Dios. Y Dios es amor. Dios ha querido, sin duda, elegir a una Madre adornada especialmente con la cualidad o virtud que le define. Por eso María tuvo que vivir en grado muy alto la virtud del amor, de la caridad. Fue, sin duda, una de sus principales señas de identidad. Además, ha sido la única criatura capaz de un amor perfecto y puro, sin sombra de egoísmo o desorden. Porque sólo ella ha sido inmaculada; y así sólo Ella ha sido capaz de amar a Dios, Su Hijo, como Él merecía y quería ser amado.

Ese amor suyo era un amor concreto y real. El amor no son palabras bonitas. Son obras. "Amar es el hecho mismo de amar", dirá San Agustín. La caridad no son buenos deseos. Es la entrega desinteresada a los demás. Y eso es precisamente lo que encontramos en la vida de la Santísima Virgen: un amor auténtico, traducido en una entrega de sí mismo a Dios y a los demás. María irradiaba amor por los cuatro costados y varios kilómetros a la redonda. La casa de la sagrada familia debía estar imbuida de caridad.

Así como su barrio, todo el pueblo e incluso gran parte de la comarca... Las hondas expansivas del amor, cuando es real, se difunden prodigiosamente con longitudes insospechadas. El amor de la Virgen en la casa de Nazaret, como en las otras donde vivía, le hacía oler realmente a cielo allí. Ese gran amor de esposa, de madre, de amigo que se respiraba a su alrededor, estaba entretelado con mil y un detalles. Con qué sonrisa y ternura abría la Santísima Virgen cada nuevo día de José y del niño con su puntual y acogedor "buenos días"; y de igual manera lo cerraría con un "buenas noches" lleno de petición y cariño. ¡Cuántas sorpresas y regalos agradables esperaban al Niño Dios detrás de cada "cumpleaños feliz" seguido del beso y el abrazo de su Madre! Cómo sabía preparar los guisos que más le gustaban a José; y aquellos otros que amaban al niño Jesús. Qué bueno era para ella tener siempre la ropa limpia y ordenada de los dos hombres de la casa. Con cuánta atención y paciencia escuchaba las aventuras de la infancia que Jesús le contaba después de sus incansables aventuras con sus amigos; y también los éxitos y desgracias de la época del carpintero de José. ¿Cuántas veces María se habrá apresurado a terminar las tareas domésticas para llevarle un bocadillo a su esposo y echarle una mano en el trabajo? Fue el amor el que transformó cada uno de estos actos aparentemente normales y banales en sublimes. Donde hay amor, lo más normal se convierte en extraordinario y no hay tal cosa como lo banal. En María ninguna caricia era superficial o mecánica, ningún abrazo cansado o distraído, ningún beso de repertorio, ninguna sonrisa falsa. "En ella", dice San Bernardo, "no hay nada grave, nada terrible; todo es dulzura". Todo lo que hacía estaba imbuido de esa viveza de amor que nunca se marchita.
